Add the fetus to the family size of a pregnant woman.

MassHealth rounds monthly totals up and uses a gross income test for people under age 65

Seniors are entitled to a \$20 per month standard deduction, and must also meet an asset test.

The Senior deductible income standard is \$522 per mo. for an individual;\$650 per mo. for a couple.

The income standard for an institutionalized individual is \$60 per month.

The MassHealth agency also determines financial eligibility for Commonwealth Care and Free Care (Uncompensated Care/Health Safety Net)
