The Center for Public Representation is a public interest law firm which has been assisting people with disabilities, both in the community and in institutional settings, for over thirty-five years. The Center is a national and state legal support center, providing technical assistance and support to disability rights programs in all fifty States, as well as to public and private attorneys who represent people with disabilities in the Commonwealth.
