Note: The increase and percentage change is within that demographic category. For example, there were 29 K (17%) more elderly clients in August 2021 than in February 2020

SNAP's client demographics have also changed since before COVID

- The number of SNAP clients increased by 208 K (28%)
 - Working age adults (18-59) made up the largest share of this increase (56%)
- The proportion of clients *without* a disability make up a larger share of caseload
 - 70% now vs. 64% pre-COVID
- The number of non-citizens in an active SNAP family increased steadily, with many coming on after the revocation of the public charge rule in March 2021
