

Are you homeless or having problems with your housing?

Starting July 1, 2009, Emergency Assistance (EA) will be managed by the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD).

- ♦ These changes will not affect your benefits.
- ◆ You can still visit DTA local offices for help with family emergency shelter.
- When you go to your DTA office, tell the receptionist if you would like to see your DTA case manager (SNAP, TAFDC, EAEDC, Employment Services), your DHCD homeless coordinator (shelter), or both.
- DTA will still offer SNAP (formerly Food Stamps),
 TAFDC, EAEDC, and Employment Services.
