24-Month Time Limit and Available Services

Overview

Many recipients are subject to the 24-month time limits. This means their TAFDC cases will close and their cash assistance will stop at the end of 24 months. Therefore, it is important to help them find a job and become self-sufficient **before** their cases are closed. Workers must ensure that recipients are aware of all the services available to them both before and after their cases close, including:

- Employment Services Program (ESP),
- Child Care and Early Education,
- Transitional Child Care, and
- Transitional MassHealth.

Local Office Initiatives

Two local offices have developed guides that they use in their respective offices to make recipients aware of available services. Attached are copies for your review.

- 1. North Shore's *Prepare for the Future* (see Exhibit A) This handout is given to recipients informing them of the:
 - a. date their benefits will stop, and
 - b. available job services.

- 2. Davis Square ESP Referral Guide (see Exhibit B) This guide explains:
 - a. ESP services,
 - b. who may be eligible for these services,
 - c. where services may be obtained in their area,
 - d. child care eligibility, and
 - e. other resources in their area.
