| Background            | A Superior Court judge in the <i>Smith v. McIntire</i> lawsuit has ruled that<br>certain TAFDC regulations related to the 24-month extension process<br>are unlawful. Among the regulations found unlawful are sections of 106<br>CMR 203.210. Specifically, the Department may not require that an<br>individual granted an extension be required to work or perform<br>work-related activities for a total of 35 hours a week.   |
| Action to be<br>Taken | As a result, no current extension case may be closed for failing to<br>meet the 35-hour requirement. Systems is currently making<br>changes to ensure that this does not occur. It is anticipated these<br>system changes will be in place prior to August 15, 2000. Until the<br>changes are in place TAO staff are not to enter any wage or hour<br>information for an extension case onto either PACES or<br>BEACON. This will ensure that the system will not inadvortently<br>terminate cases which may be affected by this decision. You will receive<br>additional instructions prior to August 15, 2000. |
|                       | The Department is in the process of reviewing the entire $Smith v$ .<br><i>McIntire</i> decision and additional procedures and regulations will be<br>issued as soon as possible.  |
