10/1/2009 Cost-of-Living Changes for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

Overview

The annual SNAP COLA was processed during the weekend of September 18, 2009. This a mass change affecting the entire SNAP caseload.

The following is a summary of the cost-of-living changes in SNAP:

Gross, Net and 165 Percent Income Eligibility Standards - The Gross, Net and 165 Percent Income Eligibility Standards have increased.

Shelter Deduction - The maximum shelter deduction (for households not comprised of any elderly or disabled member) has increased to \$459.

Standard Deduction: The standard deduction for all household sizes has changed:

- The standard deduction for household sizes 1 to 3 has decreased.
- The standard deduction for household sizes 4 and above has increased.

Standard Utility Allowance (SUA)

- The Nonheating SUA remains \$375;
- The Phone SUA remains \$44;
- The Bay State CAP SUA remains \$375;
- The Heating/Cooling SUA has decreased to \$611.

Maximum Benefit Levels - The maximum SNAP benefit levels for all household sizes remain at the amounts issued with the April 2009 ARRA changes.

Overview (Continued)

Minimum Benefit Level - The minimum benefit level for eligible one- and two-person households remains at \$16.

Homeless Shelter/Utility Deduction - The Homeless Shelter/Utility Deduction remains at \$143.

The COLA State Letter will be issued later.

Impact of COLA on SNAP Benefits

The COLA recalculation results show that the majority of SNAP households who will be sent a change notice are negatively impacted by the COLA. Most households will receive a small decrease in SNAP benefits caused by the reduction of the standard deduction amount (for household sizes 1, 2 and 3) and the reduction of the heating/cooling SUA. The COLA notices to active households have been carefully worded to alert clients that this COLA will result in a decrease in benefits for some households.

To alleviate the burden the anticipated high call volume could place on TAOs and Recipient Services, a special phone bank has been established to address COLA-related calls. In addition, this year, the COLA notices do not include the case managers' phone numbers or Recipient Services phone number but instead include only the unique phone number activated to handle COLA-related calls.

Automatic Update of Active SNAP Households

As of the close of business on 9/18/09, active SNAP cases on BEACON, including Bay State CAP, were automatically recalculated using the new COLA standards. SNAP cases with a change in benefit amount were automatically authorized. The newly calculated benefit amount is now displayed on the Active by Grantee Name view, under Assistance Unit Lists.

Report of Updated Households

A report entitled "Food Stamp 10/2009 COLA Updated Case":

- is now available on View Direct, Report ID:DTA 9023;
- lists all households that have a change in benefit amount as a result of the COLA;
- lists the household's old and new SNAP benefit amounts (as adjusted by the system);
- lists the amount added to the 10/2009 issuance (benefits owed from 10/1/2009 to 10/2009 cyclical date), if appropriate; and
- can be used for reference by TAO staff.

Client Notices

The following notices will be sent to households listed on the "Food Stamp 10/2009 COLA Updated Case" report:

- an English/Spanish notice (Attachment B) to SNAP households;
- an English/Spanish notice (Attachment C) to Bay State CAP households; and
- a multilingual notice that states, "Important! Please have this notice translated immediately."

Households With Decreased SNAP Benefit Amounts

SNAP households with a decrease in benefit caused by the COLA will not pend. The COLA is regarded as a mass change; therefore, the normal pending period required for negative actions such as a decrease in benefit will not apply in this situation.

When to Use New Standards

SNAP cases authorized after the close of business on 9/18/2009 were recalculated using the new COLA standards. As of Monday, September 21, 2009 the new COLA standards must be used in all SNAP calculations, including any necessary manual calculations.

Closed SNAP Households

Closed SNAP households, including Bay State CAP households owed additional benefits for the 10/2009 COLA, will be issued benefits. These closed households will:

- have benefits dated and issued in mid-October 2009;
- be listed on the Closed/Denied Within the Last Two Months view under Assistance Unit Lists:

Note: In mid-October the "Last Paid" date and "Benefit" amount column on this view will show which households received a prorated SNAP benefit amount for the period between 10/1/2009 and the household's cyclical start date for October;

- be sent an English/Spanish notice (Attachment D) to SNAP households;
- be sent an English/Spanish notice (Attachment E) to Bay State CAP households; and
- be sent a multilingual card that states, "Important! Please have this notice translated immediately."

Location of Eligibility Charts and Issuance Tables

Last October, effective with the new COLA standards, the eligibility charts and issuance tables associated with the COLA were removed from the regulations and posted to the mass.gov/dta website. This change has eased the administrative burden on the Department by eliminating the need to submit numerous pages through the State Letter process each year.

All remaining pages that were formerly a part of the SNAP COLA State Letter will be removed from the regulations this year and posted to mass.gov. The remaining regulation pages that will be posted to mass.gov/dta website include figures representing:

- the standard deduction;
- the shelter deduction:
- the standard utility allowances; and
- the Bay State CAP utility allowance.

Fuel Assistance Mailing

This year clients receiving COLA notices will also receive information about fuel assistance included with their COLA notice. This combined mailing includes the COLA notice, the income verification letter, the fuel assistance brochure and the multilingual card. Other households, who are not scheduled to receive a COLA notice, will receive the fuel assistance information through a separate mailing.

During the fuel assistance season (November through April), case managers are reminded to ask clients at every contact, if they receive fuel assistance. Remember to allow the heating/cooling SUA for clients in receipt of fuel assistance even if the client does not pay heat separately from his or her rent.
