


Please urge a favorable report on H.144/S.75 to Lift Kids Out of Deep Poverty

Rep. Decker & Sen. DiDomenico's bills set a floor for cash assistance grant levels at 50% of federal poverty level

- Cash assistance grants are only \$783/month for a family of three in 2023 (scheduled to increase to \$861/month in April 2024).
- This is still far below the Deep Poverty level (half the federal poverty level) of \$1,036/month for a family of three.
- Deep Poverty hurts kids. It causes health & emotional damage, impaired school performance, toxic stress, homelessness and housing instability.
- The bills would raise maximum grants for TAFDC (families) and EAEDC (elders and persons with disabilities) by 25% a year until they reach Deep Poverty and then increase grants each year to keep pace with inflation.
