Re:	EAEDC: Designation of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) For Ethiopia
Overview	Due to the ongoing conflict-related violence and humanitarian crisis in

Due to the ongoing conflict-related violence and humanitarian crisis in Ethiopia, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has designated new Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for Ethiopia for the 18-month period of **October 20, 2022, through April 20, 2024**.

This new designation for TPS enables Ethiopian nationals and individuals without nationality who last habitually resided in Ethiopia who are currently residing in the United States, to file initial applications for TPS, so long as they meet eligibility requirements. Individuals who are approved or have pending status for TPS must have documentation from USCIS verifying this temporary status.

Once verified, individuals are considered Permanently Residing Under Color of Law (PRUCOL) for purposes of EAEDC eligibility, and accordingly, may be eligible for EAEDC provided they meet all other EAEDC nonfinancial and financial requirements.

**Important:** Individuals who are approved or pending for TPS are not eligible for SNAP or TAFDC benefits, **unless** they qualify under a different noncitizen status, such as Refugee.
