Re: SNAP: Rollback of Student COVID-19 Temporary Procedures

Overview

The Consolidated Appropriations Act effective December 27, 2020 included a provision that expanded college student eligibility to include:

- Students who are eligible to participate in a State or federally financed work study during the regular school year, but who may not be actively participating in work study; and
- Students with an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0 in the current academic year.

The expansion of college student eligibility provision is tied to the end of the Public Health Emergency (PHE) and will be phased out.

Purpose

The purpose of this Online Guide update is to advise staff that the temporary student exemptions are ending due to the end of the Public Health Emergency.

Substantive Changes

Staff must follow the procedures relative to student status as outlined below:

New Applications

For new applications, temporary exemptions will remain in effect for applications received <u>on or before June 9, 2023</u>. Staff must process new applications received <u>on or after June 10, 2023</u> using permanent student procedures only.

Existing Households

For Recertifications, temporary exemptions will remain in effect for Recertifications received through and including June 30, 2023. Recertifications received on or after July 1, 2023 must be processed using permanent student procedures only.

During Case Maintenance, households are not required to report if a student loses eligibility for one of the temporary college student exemptions. Only if a household directly reports information to DTA that the student is no longer eligible for a temporary exemption, we must then screen for another student exemption prior to determining the student's eligibility.

Please note that the Educational Income for SNAP Households guidance has been removed from the COVID-19 book and placed in permanent Online Guide pages. The Processing College Student Eligibility page will remain in the COVID-19 book during this transition phase and be removed once it is no longer applicable to new applications and recertifications received in the periods outlined above.
