Dear Supervisor of Records,

On June 30, 2020 I submitted a public record request to Daniel Tsai, the Director of the Office of Medicaid, Executive Office of Health and Human Services through the EOHHS Public Records Office website. The agency notified me that they would not be able to reply until July 15, 2020 and I replied that I had no objection to that delay. On July 15, 2020 I received a response acknowledging receipt of my request and estimating a response by July 22, 2020. Since then I have exchanged several more emails with the public records office, and have been informed that my request is still under review.

To date, the agency has not supplied the requested records or claimed that the requested records are exempt from disclosure. The records I am seeking are public records within the meaning of G.L. c. 66 § 10 and G.L. c. 4 § 7 and not subject to any exemption.

- 2. Any public records containing any of the following information about MassHealth Estate Recovery.
  - a. The total number of claims filed
  - b. Of claims filed, the total amount claimed including any break out of amounts claimed for mandatory estate recovery (nursing facility or other institutional care, home and community based services and related hospitals and prescription drugs) and for optional estate recovery (any other services)
  - c. Of claims filed, the total number claiming recovery for the amount of a capitated payments to managed care organizations including Senior Care Organizations, Integrated Care Organizations and PACE plans and the total amount claimed for said capitated managed care payments.
  - d. Of claims filed, the total number in which representatives for the Estate disallowed a claim or requested a hardship waiver or a deferral.
  - e. The total number of hardship waivers requested and how many were initially granted on a conditional basis, and the total number denied.

- 9. Information on the number of MassHealth beneficiaries who are age 55 or older and not residents of a nursing facility or other institutional setting, and not enrolled in any Home and Community Based waiver program such as the Frail Elder Waiver.

The Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS), responds to the above referenced public records request (PRR) received on June 30, 2020, wherein you requested the following records:

All requests for information relate to the most recent three year period for which information is available unless otherwise indicated.

- 1. Any reports, presentations, or other documents describing MassHealth Estate Recovery including claims, characteristics of decedents and estates subject to claims, collections, and subregulatory policies and practices or other agency guidance related to Estate Recovery.

  - b. Please note EOHHS continues to process your request to gather potentially responsive records. EOHHS is unable to provide a complete response by July 15, 2020; doing so would unduly burden EOHHS and interfere with its other responsibilities. Pursuant to G.L. c. 66 § 10(b)(vi), EOHHS estimates a response will issue by July 22, 2020 (15 business days after PRR receipt).
