



**Are you a low-income community college student struggling to afford food?**

## You might be eligible for **SNAP** benefits!

Low-income college students who meet certain eligibility rules might be eligible for SNAP to help buy groceries - up to **\$204 per month** for one person!

Community college students may be eligible for SNAP if their course of study is likely to lead to employment or is a career or technical education program. These students do not have to work 20 hours per week or get Work-Study to be eligible for SNAP.

Students who live with their parents and are under 22 must apply for SNAP with their parents. If you are not a U.S. citizen, you must meet certain immigration status rules. And there are financial and other rules students must meet to be eligible. Go to **DTAConnect.com** to apply for SNAP.
