Re:	Suspension of SSFSP Benefits
Background	Budget shortfalls have left the Department without full funding for SSFSP for the remainder of fiscal year 2002. The Department must suspend benefits to SSFPS recipients beginning May 7, 2002. To implement this change, a "funding reduction" percentage will be put in place in BEACON effective May 1, 2002. For SSFSP benefits, the percentage used will be zero. SSFSP applications authorized on BEACON on or after May 1 and pending
	transactions that release on or after May 1 will be calculated using the new (zero) benefit amount.Instructions for processing expedited food stamp benefits begin on page 2 Instructions for processing applications begin on page 3.
Notices	On April 26, 2002, notices will be sent to current FS AUs with an SSFSP member on file as of close of business April 25, 2002, informing them of the suspensions.
	Recipients of SSFSP-only benefits will receive a notice informing them of the suspension of the SSFSP benefits (Attachment A).
	Recipients of federal food stamp benefits and SSFSP benefits ("Combination AUs") will receive a notice informing them that SSFSP benefits will be suspended to zero. This notice will include the actual amount of federal food stamp benefits (Attachment B).

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Notices (continued)	Attachment C must be given or mailed to any SSFSP-only or Combination AU whose application is authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30 because these applicants will not receive the April 26, 2002 mailing.
Expedited Food Stamp Benefits Authorized by Close of Business April 25, 2002	Expedited SSFSP-only and Combination AU benefits authorized by close of business April 25 will not be impacted by this suspension.
Day 7 Expedited Benefits Authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30	 Only those expedited benefits requiring authorization on April 26, April 29 or April 30 (subject to day 7 expedited processing time frames) should be authorized on those dates. For expedited benefits authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30, BEACON will: calculate expedited benefits owed from the date of application based on the higher benefit amount and generate that benefit; and generate an expedited approval notice regarding this benefit amount. AU Managers must give or mail Attachment C to all in this group as they will NOT get the BEACON-generated notice mailed on April 26.
Expedited Benefits Authorized On or After May 1 With an Effective Date of May 6 or Earlier	 For expedited benefits authorized on or after May I with an effective date of May 6 or earlier, BEACON will: calculate expedited federal food stamp benefits from the date of application and generate that benefit, if eligible, and approve the SSFSP benefits at zero; and generate an expedited approval notice regarding the federal food stamp benefit amount, if eligible, and the zero SSFSP benefit amount.
	The AU Manager must issue a supplemental payment for the expedited SSFSP benefits owed for the period of eligibility from the application date to the appropriate date in the chart on page 4. The supplemental payment must be issued following the instructions also found on page 4.
Expedited Benefits Authorized On or After May 7 With an Effective Date Of May 7 or Later	 Applications for expedited benefits taken on or after May 7 must be processed. If eligible, BEACON will: calculate expedited federal food stamp benefits from the date of application and generate that benefit, if eligible, and approve the SSFSP benefits at zero; and generate an expedited approval notice regarding the federal food stamp benefit amount, if eligible, and the zero SSFSP benefit amount.
	In any of these situations, once expedited food stamp benefits are authorized, the pending application must be either approved or denied within the food stamp application processing time frames.

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Applications	AU Managers and AU Supervisors should make every effort to authorize pending SSFSP-only or Combination AU applications by close of business April 25, 2002. These applicants will receive the appropriate notice regarding the SSFSP suspension and will have their food stamp benefits automatically recalculated.
Applications Authorized by Close of Business April 25, 2002	 For applications authorized by close of business April 25, 2002, BEACON will: calculate current federal and state benefits owed from the date of application and generate a prorated benefit based on the higher SSFSP benefit amount through the day before the effective date of the zero SSFSP benefit amount (see chart on page 4); and generate an approval notice regarding this amount. Note: These applicants will receive the appropriate notice (Attachment A or B) referenced on page 1.
	Since these are now active AUs, BEACON will recalculate the zero amount for May SSFSP benefits if the SSN ends in "4" through "9" or June SSFSP benefits if the SSN ends in "0" through "3" based upon the chart found on page 5.
	No additional AU Manager action is needed.
Day 30 Applications Authorized on April 26, April 29, or April 30	Applications pending on April 26, 2002, that are not subject to the day 30 food stamp application processing deadline, should be held and authorized on or after May 1, 2002. BEACON will calculate the benefit and generate the notice based on the zero SSFSP benefit amount.
	If an application subject to the day 30 food stamp application deadline must be authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30, AU Managers MUST process that application.
	 For applicants authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30, BEACON will: calculate current federal or state benefits owed from the date of application and generate a prorated benefit based on the higher SSFSP benefit amount through the day before the effective date of the zero SSFSP benefit amount (see chart on page 4); and generate an approval notice regarding this zero SSFSP benefit amount.

AU Managers must give or mail Attachment C to all applicants authorized on April 26, April 29 or April 30 as they will NOT get the BEACON-generated notice mailed on April 26.

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Applications (continued) Applications Authorized On or

After May 1 With an Effective Date of May 6 or Earlier For applications authorized on or after May 1 with an effective date of May 6 or earlier, BEACON will:

- calculate and generate federal food stamp benefits owed, if eligible, and approve the SSFSP benefits at zero; and
 - generate an approval notice regarding the federal food stamp benefit amount, if eligible, and the zero SSFSP benefit amount.

The AU Manager must issue a supplemental payment for the SSFSP benefits owed from the application date to the appropriate date in the chart below:

AU Managers must calculate the supplemental payment for benefits owed as follows:

- On the Financial Tab of the Results Tab on the Eligibility Explorer window, click on the Benefit caret and use the State Funding Reduction figure as the difference between the higher SSFSP amount and the new zero amount;
- Multiply that amount by 12 (months) to get a yearly total;
- Divide that amount by 365 (days) to get a daily total;
- Multiply that amount by the number of days from the date of application to the appropriate date in the chart above; and
- Enter this amount on the Related Benefits window and authorize this on the Interview Wrap-up window.

Applications (continued) Applications Taken On or After May 7 With an Effective Date

of May 7 or Later

Applications taken on or after May 7 must be processed. If eligible, BEACON will:

- calculate and generate federal food stamp benefits owed, if eligible, and approve the SSFSP benefits at zero; and
- generate an approval notice regarding the federal food stamp benefit amount, if eligible, and the zero SSFSP benefit amount.

No additional AU Manager action is needed.

Ongoing Recipient Changes

All SSFSP-only and Combination AUs will be recalculated during the regular AU processing schedule, based on the BEACON Release Date for each SSN, starting with the release date of SSN's ending in 4 (May 1, 2002). SSNs ending in "0" through "3" will receive their regular SSFSP benefits for May.

Changes Resulting In Retroactive Supplemental Benefits	On or after May 1 any change in an AU that contains an SSFSP member will be calculated at the zero benefit amount. The AU Manager must issue a supplemental payment for the amount of money owed to the recipient at the higher amount from the change effective date to the day <i>before</i> the benefit date for the zero SSFSP benefit amount found on the chart on page 4. This must be issued on BEACON in the Related Benefits window.	
Recoupment	Recipients having money recouped from their SSFSP benefits will have the recoupment suspended.	
	Recipients having money recouped from their federal food stamp benefits <i>will not be</i> impacted.
