# Analysis of Child Fatalities & Near Fatalities

**April 2014** 

#### **Child Near Fatalities in 2012**

The DCF Case Investigation Unit (CIU) receives notification of all reports of abuse or neglect that meet the definition of "near fatality." DCF defines a "near fatality" as any case where a doctor or hospital has filed a 51A report and determined the child named in the report to be in "serious" or "critical" condition as a result of physical and/or sexual abuse or neglect, <u>and</u> that the condition is considered to be <u>life threatening</u>. Upon receiving notification of a near fatality from an area office, CIU staff review all information about the case contained in FamilyNet (DCF's automated case management system). This preliminary data collection serves as the basis for their investigation. The CIU process for near fatalities is a paper review; there are no meetings with area office managers or staff. However, CIU investigators may call area office managers or staff for additional information.

There were 18 near fatalities reported to DCF during 2012 (13 boys and 5 girls). Abusive head trauma injuries<sup>1</sup> were diagnosed in 12 of the 18 near fatalities. Four (4) of the 12 abusive head trauma victims also had bodily injuries (fractures and bruises). The remaining 6 near fatalities had the following injuries: skull fracture (2), traumatic neck/throat injuries (2 siblings), internal injuries/bruises/fracture (1), and abdominal injuries from a motor vehicle accident (1).

Neglect was a factor in the near fatalities of 2 children, physical abuse was a factor for 6 children, and both physical abuse and neglect were factors for 10 children. The victimized children included 13 (72%) infants (less than 1 year old), 1 two-year old, 2 three-year olds, 1 five-year old, and 1 eight-year old. Nine (9) of the children were White and 2 were Black. Race was unknown for 7 children. Seven (7) of the 18 children with near fatal injuries were identified as Hispanic.

Of the 17 families (2 child victims were siblings), 8 were known to DCF (3 open protective and 5 closed cases) and 9 were unknown (no prior history). None of the children were in DCF custody and none were in placement. Median ages of the perpetrators were 23.5 years for mothers and 27 years for fathers. Seven mothers and 5 fathers had a prior history with DCF. Current family issues were mental illness (6), domestic violence (5), and substance abuse (6). (Tables A1 and A2)

#### Child Fatalities in 2012

#### Child Fatalities for Families Open or Recently Involved with DCF

All child deaths in families open or recently involved ("known") to DCF are reported to the Case Investigation Unit, regardless of how the child died.<sup>2</sup> CIU staff conduct investigations that focus on a review of the services provided to the family and the circumstances surrounding the death. Each investigation includes, but is not limited to, a comprehensive review of the case record and a visit to the DCF Area Office to interview social work staff involved with the case. The purpose of this review is to determine if DCF needs to address any case practice or policy issues.

Since its formation in the late 1980s, the CIU has collected information on deceased children whose families had the following status with DCF:

- families with an open case;
- families being investigated as the result of a 51A report<sup>3</sup> received <u>prior</u> to the child's death<sup>4</sup>;
- families with cases that closed within the six months preceding the child's death; and
- families who had a supported 51A report within six months preceding the child's death, but the case was not opened for services.

Thirty-nine (39) children in families with an open or recently<sup>5</sup> closed DCF case status died in 2012. As determined by the medical examiner, 10 of these children died from natural causes, 3 were homicides, and 7 died in accidents. Ten (10) deceased children have undergone an autopsy but as of the writing of this report, the manner of death remains pending the completion of the forensic investigation. For an additional 9 children, the manner of death was "undetermined" following an autopsy by a medical examiner. Child maltreatment (neglect/physical abuse) was found by DCF to be the cause or contributing factor in 7 of the 39 deaths. (**Table A3**)

Sixty-seven percent (67%) of these deceased children were infants (less than one-year old), 13% were 1-6 years old, and 21% were adolescents (12-17 years old). Six (6) of the 39 children were in DCF custody at the time of their death. Of the 6 children in DCF custody, 5 were in placement: two (2) were hospitalized infants, 2 were infants in foster homes (unrelated and kinship) and 1 was a 14-year-old boy on the run from placement. (**Table A3**)

- Hospitalized infant: manner of death "pending investigation" (prenatal drug exposure, premature birth, congenital); supported allegations of neglect by parents
- Hospitalized infant: manner of death "accidental" (prenatal drug exposure, premature birth); supported allegation of neglect by mother
- Foster care infant (unrelated home): manner of death "undetermined" (SIDS/unsafe sleeping conditions)
- Foster care infant (kinship home): manner of death "pending completion of investigation" (ill-defined and unspecified cause)
- Teenage boy on the run from placement: manner of death "accidental" (injuries from motor vehicle accident)

Over the past 24 years, DCF child deaths (on open or recently closed cases) have ranged from a high of 89 to a low of 30 fatalities per year, with a median of 41 fatalities. The most notable change was the rise in infant deaths, which in 2012 was 67% (n=26) of the 39 deaths. Eight (8) of the infant deaths were determined by the medical examiner to be from natural causes, 2 were accidents, 1 was a homicide, 7 were pending an investigation, and 8 were undetermined. A finding of "undetermined" is utilized when it is impossible for the medical examiner to establish the circumstances of death with reasonable medical certainty after a thorough investigation. DCF determined that the sleeping conditions for 10 of the 26 infants did not meet the standards set in the MA Department of Public Health's Safe Sleep policy. (**Tables A3 and A5**)

Regardless of setting, most deaths have been due to natural causes and to a lesser degree accidents. In the past 12 years (2001-2012), there have been 2 maltreatment-related fatalities in foster care and none in residential care. There was an accidental death in 2001 when a child died while in unrelated foster care (neglect). In 2005, a child in unrelated foster care was a homicide victim (physical abuse and neglect).

#### Child Fatalities for Families with a Non-Current or No DCF History

In 2001, the CIU began collecting information on all deceased children for whom a 51A report was filed including those from families previously unknown to DCF and families with cases closed more than six months prior to the child's death. This group of child fatalities is limited to those children where abuse/neglect was the direct cause of death or was a contributing factor to the cause of death. The data collected on these maltreatment deaths are not as comprehensive as the data collected on families with current or recent DCF involvement. Data are gathered via phone calls to area office staff and a review of case information in the DCF case management information system (FamilyNet).

The deaths of an additional 12 children were reported to DCF and found to be maltreatment-related. Six (6) children were from families not previously known to DCF and 6 were from families whose cases had been closed for more than six months at the time of death. (**Table A4**)

#### **Unsafe Sleep**

Of the aforementioned 51 child fatalities (39 for families known to DCF and 12 for families with non-current or no DCF history), 17 involved children where the sleep environment did not meet the standards recommended in the MA Department of Public Health (DPH) Safe Sleep Policy or as referred throughout this report as "unsafe sleep." This includes 10 families known and 7 families unknown to DCF. The medical examiner was not able to determine the manner of death for 12 (71%) of these fatalities. Of the remaining fatalities of children in unsafe sleep settings, 1 was determined by the medical examiner to be accidental and 4 were pending the completion of an investigation by the police and medical examiners. DCF investigators supported neglect as a contributing factor in 9 of the 17 fatalities of children in unsafe sleep settings. (table below, Tables A3 and A4)

#### Analysis of DCF Child Fatalities: 1989 – 2012 (Open or Recently Closed Cases)

Thirty-nine (39) children "known" to DCF died in 2012. Over the past 24 years, DCF child deaths (on open or recently closed cases) have ranged from a high of 89 to a low of 30 fatalities per year, with a median of 41 fatalities. Higher than prior years, fatalities involving children under the age of one-year represented 67% of 2012 fatalities.

#### Child Maltreatment-Related Fatalities: 2001 – 2012

The following data are <u>limited</u> to child fatalities where maltreatment was a direct cause of death or a contributing factor to the cause of death. While DCF has maintained data on maltreatment-related deaths since 1989, data collection was limited to children in families with an open or recently closed DCF case. Beginning in 2001, DCF began compiling data on maltreatment-related deaths of children whose families were unknown to DCF and children whose families had their DCF cases closed more than six months prior to the child's death. The following analysis includes maltreatment-related deaths for children in families known and unknown to the Department.

Of the 51 child fatalities in 2012 (39 for families known to DCF and 12 for families with non-current or no DCF history), there were 19 (37% of 51) child fatalities with supported allegations of neglect or physical abuse by a caretaker. (**Table A7**)

- Neglect was a factor in 17 deaths, physical abuse was factor in 1 death, and both neglect and physical abuse were factors in 1 death. (**Table A7**)
- Ten (10) of the deaths involved multiple perpetrators (**Table A6**). Perpetrators of neglect included 15 mothers, 11 fathers, 1 female relative, and 1 male relative. Perpetrators of physical abuse were 1 father and 1 male relative. (**Table A8**)
- Maltreatment-related deaths have ranged from 7 to 23 per year, with a median of 17-18 deaths from 2001-2012. (**Table A7**)
- Maltreatment-related deaths of children under age one year have ranged from 4 to 19 per year, with a median of 8-9 deaths from 2001-2012. (**Table A7**)
- Seventeen (17) of the 19 victims of maltreatment were living at home/kin at the time of death (**Table A7**). Two (2) were in hospitals.
- DCF case statuses of the 19 families:
  - o Five (5) were open protective cases for 6 months or less.
  - One (1) was an open protective case for more than 6 months.
  - One (1) case had been closed for 6 months or less.
  - O Six (6) cases had been closed for more than 6 months.
  - o Six (6) families were unknown to DCF. (**Table A7**)

#### **Summary of 19 Maltreatment-Related Child Fatalities in 2012**

#### 17 Neglect-Related Deaths:

- Three (3) children drowned (bathtub, pool, pond).
- Nine (9) infants were at risk due to unsafe sleeping conditions (4 were possible SIDS).
- Two (2) premature infants had medical complications due to prenatal drug exposure (cocaine).
- Two (2) children died from hyperthermia while left unattended in cars.
- One (1) child asphyxiated on a grape.

#### 1 Physical Abuse-Related Death:

• Child died from gunshot wounds (father perpetrator)

#### 1 Physical Abuse- and Neglect-related Death:

• Infant: ill-defined and unspecified cause (unexplained brain injury)
